### **Three Individuals Indicted in Attempted Murder, Eluding Case**

**TRENTON** – A Mercer County grand jury returned a 27-count indictment on Wednesday charging three individuals in connection with a May 2, 2013, incident where two men were shot and the assailants eluded police both by car and on foot, Mercer County Prosecutor Joseph L. Bocchini Jr. announced.

Timothy Miller, 33, of Willingboro, and Edward Acosta, 22, of Lincoln Avenue, Trenton, were indicted on two counts of first-degree attempted murder, eluding, resisting arrest, aggravated assault, and multiple drug and weapons charges. Miller was additionally indicted on one count of receiving stolen property, one count of certain persons not to possess a firearm and one count of aggravated assault on a police officer for pointing a handgun at Trenton police officer George Wilson.

The driver of the vehicle, Tiffany Wright, 31, of Beakes Avenue, Trenton, was also charged in the indictment with one count of third-degree eluding and seven counts of drug-related offenses.

The investigation revealed that on May 2, 2103, around 8 p.m., Miller and Acosta got out of a car driven by Miller's girlfriend, later identified as Wright, and started shooting at two men on Montgomery Street in Trenton. The men jumped back into the vehicle and Wright drove off. Police were in the area of the shooting and witnessed a 2002 red Lexus driving away from the scene. Police attempted to stop the vehicle, but it kept going.

Wright eventually stopped the car, and Miller and Acosta fled the vehicle on foot. Wright was apprehended immediately while police ran after Miller and Acosta. Trenton Police Officer Wilson followed Miller down an alley between Bond Street and East Ingham Avenue, where Miller turned and pointed a handgun at Wilson. Wilson fired one shot, striking Miller in the foot. Miller ran into a nearby deli, where he was arrested. Police located Miller's weapon in the alley.

Acosta was arrested a few days later during a traffic stop in Hamilton.

Miller and Acosta both remain in the Mercer County Correction Center in lieu of \$1 million bail. Wright is free on \$20,000 bail.

Deputy First Assistant Prosecutor Kimberly Lacken presented the case to the grand jury.

Despite having been indicted, every defendant is presumed innocent until found guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.
