### **Trenton Man Indicted for Murder**

Acting Mercer County Prosecutor Angelo J. Onofri reported that a Mercer County grand jury returned a four-count indictment last week charging a Trenton man with the stabbing death of 43-year-old Edward Nock.

Isaac J. Grey (DOB 10.22.83), of Beakes Street, Trenton, was indicted on one count of first-degree murder, one count of third-degree possession of a weapon for an unlawful purpose, one count of fourth-degree unlawful possession of a weapon and one count of fourth-degree certain persons not to possess a weapon.

The charges are the result of an investigation by the Mercer County Homicide Task Force. At approximately 9:45 p.m. on June 30, 2015, Trenton police received a call of a stabbing in progress. Responding officers located Nock lying on the floor of an apartment in the first block of Beakes Street suffering from an apparent stab wound to the abdomen. Nock was transported to Capital Health Regional Medical Center where he succumbed to his injuries.

Grey was identified as a suspect and detectives developed leads that he was in Philadelphia. With assistance from the U.S. Marshals NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force – Trenton Division and the U.S. Marshals Regional Fugitive Task Force – Philadelphia Division, Grey was located at a house on Newkirk Street at approximately 11 a.m. on July 2, 2015, and taken into custody. He remains in jail on \$750,000 bail.

Assistant Prosecutor Stacey Geurds presented the case to the grand jury.

Despite having been indicted, every defendant is presumed innocent until found guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.
