**Four Men Indicted for Home Invasion Murder**

**TRENTON** – A Mercer County grand jury returned a 16-count indictment last week charging four men with the August 2013 shooting death of Kayron Jones, Mercer County Prosecutor Joseph L. Bocchini Jr. announced.

Just after 12:30 a.m. on August 16, 2013, Trenton police responded to 640 N. Olden Avenue on a report of a shooting in progress. Jones was found unresponsive and suffering from a gunshot wound to the chest. He was transported to Capital Health Regional Medical Center where he succumbed to his injuries. Through surveillance video and eyewitness accounts, police learned that armed men broke into Jones' home through a window in the back, robbed two people on the first floor, and fired a shot that traveled through Jones' hand and into his chest.

The indictment, returned on April 2, charges Anthony Hemingway, 25, of Trenton, Naquan Chance, 25, of Trenton, London Feliciano, 25, of Trenton and Quosheon Williams, 23, of Lawrenceville, each with murder, felony murder, three counts of robbery, burglary, three counts of aggravated assault, and multiple weapons offenses.

Hemingway, Feliciano and Williams remain in jail in lieu of \$1 million bail each. Feliciano remains in jail in lieu of \$750,000 bail.

Assistant Prosecutor Stacey Geurds presented the case to the grand jury. The case remains under investigation by Trenton Police Detective Ryan Woodhead of the Mercer County Homicide Task Force. Anyone with any information regarding the case is asked to contact Detective Woodhead at (609) 847-3015.

Despite having been indicted, every defendant is presumed innocent until found guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.
