**Ewing Man Arrested in Georgia**  
*Charged with Sexual Assault in West Windsor*

Mercer County Prosecutor Joseph L. Bocchini Jr. and West Windsor Township Police Chief Joseph M. Pica Jr. reported today that a Ewing man charged with sexually assaulting a young boy in West Windsor was arrested in Georgia.

Thomas J. Curran, age 55, of Ewing, is charged with one count of first-degree aggravated sexual assault, one count of second-degree sexual assault and one count of second-degree endangering the welfare of a child.

It is alleged that Curran engaged in inappropriate sexual contact with the 11-year-old male victim on numerous occasions between April 2013 and June 2013 while acting as an after-school caregiver in the victim's West Windsor home.

Curran is a former dean of students and science teacher at The American Boychoir School.

On Friday, Curran was located and taken into custody in Woodstock, Georgia, as a result of a joint investigative effort by the U.S. Marshals NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force and the Georgia Regional Fugitive Task Force. After signing a waiver of extradition, Curran was transported to New Jersey on Monday by Mercer County Prosecutor's Detective Anthony Petracca and West Windsor Township Police Detective David Jelinski. He is being held in the Mercer County Correction Center in lieu of \$250,000 bail and is scheduled to appear in Mercer County Superior Court on Friday, February 7.
